It would be fair to say that the first half of the match, whilst competitive, collectively the boys appeared a little tentative. Quarter one was even from a territory point of view, with neither team able to make the most of their opportunities. The second quarter was more one sided, with the ball spending a lot of time in the Westbrook defensive zone. The back four of Beau, Carter, Freddie and Tom were seeing a lot of the ball, while our forwards struggled to get a touch.

The half-time break had Coach Jarrod channelling his inner Barassi – well maybe not quite – but he did ask for more aggression at the ball from the boys. To their credit the intensity from the entire group lifted in the second half. As a result, Westbrook were dominant in the third term and able to translate this on to the scoreboard.

Reflecting once more on the progression of the team relative to Hornsby/Berowra, at three-quarter time it was 2 goals apiece. A little over 12 months earlier Hornsby/Berowra had completely dominated the boys in round 1 of 2021.

The final quarter was more even, with Westbrook probably slightly ahead in terms of time spent in the attacking half of the ground. Round 10 was a big game for the U12 Div. 2 team. Not only was it Team Photo and the Westbrook Support MND Day which saw a brave Mark Lean-Fore (Westbrook President) and Nathan Rayment (U12 Div. 2 Runner) take part the ice bucket challenge, but this day also saw the first of our playing group reach the 50 game milestone – Congratulations Samuel on this fantastic achievement.

This round also saw us coming up against the Lane Cove Cats, and whilst they had a few players out with illness and injury resulting in them fronting up with a team of 13, as they had recently come down from Div. 1 they could not be taken lightly. We had 18 players available of the day, so we agreed to lend them 2 players per quarter to ensure as many players as possible got a fair run. I would like to express how proud I was that each player who went across to help the opposition continued to try their hardest – each of these players showed great integrity and sportsmanship that they are to be commended for, especially Leonard who kicked a goal for the opposition – well done boys and thank you.

After the photos, ice bucket challenge and Samuel had run through his milestone banner, the game commenced at 11am with Cory Mardling as acting captain. Leonard Watson quickly asserted his dominance in the ruck contests in the first quarter, enabling us to win the ball out of the middle and go on the offense. As a result, the ball spent the most time in our forward line, which we were able to capitalise on, taking a 3 goals to 1 lead at quarter-time.

To Lane Cove's credit, the game evened up in the second and third quarters. They began to win the ball out of the ruck and in to contest and, with their running players finding space and being taken advantage of with some effective ball movement, they matched the two goals we scored in both the second and third quarters. This ensuring they remained uncomfortably in touch at the beginning of the last quarter.

The 3-quarter time message centred around ensuring we 1) regained the ascendency on the contest, which is usually our forte; 2) win the ball out of the middle 3) keep the forward line open to give our forwards room to work in; and 4) stay accountable for our direct opponent when they had the ball to stifle their ball movement. To the boys' credit... they responded in emphatic fashion. With fast ball movement out of the middle, aided by Samuel Lean-Fore's run and carry and long kicking, we scored 6 goals to nothing in the last. Hayden Greenwood kicked 3 of these to end up with 5 goals for the day in a fantastic individual effort.

It is always hard to recognise individual players in what is a great team result. However I would like to recognise the efforts of a few:

- Josh North, who played his best game of the season. By directly attacking the footy when it came into
 his area he not only contributed two goals of his own, but his valuable use of handballs ensured hi set
 up a couple of others as well.
- Adam Saddick was given the task of tagging their prime mover of the first half which he did effectively.
 Whilst his direct impact on the game was lessened, indirectly he contributed a massive amount to the end result by taking this damaging player out of the game, matching his run to ensure he could no longer be used at a loose link-man.

- Ben Rayment keeps improving with every game. In our last game he was tasked with the responsibility
 of kicking out after a behind which he did with great accuracy and impact. This week he followed the
 directions around manning up tight, ensuring he was right next to his man at all times and winning the
 majority of contests that came his way.
- Samuel Lean-Fore played a fantastic 50th game. His run and carry all over the ground was a huge asset to the team and he was also able to celebrate his milestone game with a goal. We also trialled him at full-forward when he was resting off the ball (a move inspired by Dustin Martin) and there were glimpses that, in time, this move could really be a game-changer within his next 50+ games.

Overall, the boys thoroughly deserved the 55-point win, but as revealed above it was not as easy as the scoreboard suggests with the game in the balance right up until three-quarter time. However, we now go into the last 6 rounds knowing that we are capable of teaming up to kick a big score as we aim to secure a top 4 spot to qualify for finals as the end of the season.
