Finally!

Our team of pups began their competitive football journey at the commencement of 2021 against Hornsby-Berowra. It was quite the initiation as they were comprehensively outplayed by a much better team on the day. Since that time the boys, both individually and as a team, have grown and improved with each training session and match. After almost two full seasons they were able to demonstrate that improvement by not only matching, but outplaying the team that had up until now always had their measure.

The foundation of this improvement would have to be the contested play of the boys. During the match they were committed to winning possession and even when unsuccessful ensured they were very few easy wins for Hornsby-Berowra.

The boys were also dogged in defence, even when Hornsby-Berowra were able to break out into space there was a strong will to chase, close down space and force a turnover.

An example of this would be Hudson, despite being in a 1-on-3 in our defensive area, scrambling and forcing an error resulting in a stoppage. In another instance Evan chased down hard as an opponent was looking to clear the ball out of defence, and after several ensuing contests he was rewarded with a goal.

We have already seen significant improvement this year in the ability of the boys to move the ball, looking for targets and hitting them. This provided the finishing touch to the good work done in defence and the contest. An instance of this was Andrew gathering a ground ball from a centre ruck contest, then hand balling on to Billy who was able to clear it into our forward zone. Similarly Max and Thomas cleared the ruck with successive handballs to Jake who was able to send the ball into attack.

But even improvement in the fundamentals of kicking came to the fore, as Will, who has improved markedly over the last few months, was able to kick a set shot goal in the opening quarter.

In the aftermath it was quite evident that the boys enjoyed the game immensely and gained great satisfaction from such a competitive performance – and so the song was belted out with quite some gusto!

Westbrook u11 – Win by forfeit

Westbrook u12-2 (6.10-46) vs Balgowlah Suns (5.4-29)

Round 14 saw an interesting nuance to our 2022 draw where the Westbrook U12 Div 2 team played Balgowlah Suns for the second week in a row. The good news is that, whilst we went down narrowly in last week's away game, we only had to wait 7 days before we had the opportunity to reverse this result, and this time it was on our home deck in dryer conditions more suitable to our game plan. This was an important game for us as, heading into Round 14 we needed to win 2 of the remaining 3 games to secure a spot in the finals.

Knowing that Balgowlah favour a long kicking and marking game style, our key focus for the game was:

- 1. Get 1st hands on the ball and be strong in the contest. Especially at the centre bounces to ensure we are able to get the ball into our forward line and go on the offensive first.
- 2. Restrict their game style by:
 - a. competing in the air at all times and not let Balgowlah get any easy marks; whilst
 - b. applying pressure on the ball carrier to affect inaccurate disposals

Our strategy was to always force the contest where we were confident our superior "1st hands on the ball" mentality would prevail.

The game started off in a very even fashion with only 1 point separating the teams to quarter time. However, I felt that we were on top in the general play, being harder at the contest both with our tackling and when the ball was in dispute. Along with Leonard in the ruck, our in-and-under mids in Ryan and Darcy were working hard to get the ball out to our running players in Samuel and Charlie. Meanwhile, Cory admirably restricted the influence of their most dangerous goalkicker in this term, whilst on our side Hayden was able to reward the team's hard work with two valuable goals.

From then on, our physically over the ball, pressure and running game began to prevail. Cory moved into the ruck in the second quarter and continued to be a major influencer on the game, both at ball-ups and around the ground. Meanwhile Hayden, who was asked to take over Cory's run-with role, Campbell, Riley, Jake and Ben continued to hold our defence solid, restricting Balgowlah to only 1 point while we added another 2 goals through Samuel, who was resting up forward, and Marcus to increase our lead to 15 points at the main break.

We knew, however that Balgowlah were not going to give up as they too were playing to secure a finals berth. The previous week they had come from behind to secure a narrow win, so we spoke at half time about needing to continue the same effort from the first half, maintain the pressure and not let them back into the game. And I am thrilled to report that we did just that. Whilst they narrowed the gap slightly to 11 points by three-quarter time, our continued intensity and desire restricted them to just 1 further point in the last while Luke put the game out of their reach with a 4th quarter goal.

Whilst there were many, I would like to highlight two examples of the intensity our players brought to the game consistent with the pre-game tactics we spoke about:

when Adam had a fee kicked paid against him at half back, the opposition player thought he could play on and run around him. Adam laid a desperate tackle to secure a holding the ball decision and reverse the momentum of play.

As Balgowlah looked to move the ball around the half forward flank, Josh bravely left his opponent to spoil what would have been a simple Balgowlah mark to a free opponent. Instead, his effort forced the ball over the boundary line where we were able to clear in the subsequent play.

Overall, the boys played a fantastic 4-quarter game and we were victorious in what was a physical and challenging encounter. I was also extremely proud of how our boys held their head and focus on fairly playing the ball for the entire day and were not drawn into the chatter from the opposition. This was an excellent dress rehearsal for what finals football will be like in a couple of weeks! However, our job is not yet done, we have 1 win to go to secure a finals berth and are looking forward to our game against Pennant Hills, another finals contender, next week.

We also had Elliot back from a long injury layoff who fitted in seamlessly and reminded us all of how good he can be, pretty much anywhere on the ground. Then there was Ryan who ran himself off his feet, and played as a "sweeper" in the middle and won many a clearance, finally there was Noah who was again instrumental, hitting the scoreboard himself or by setting up team mates in a better position to hit the scoreboard.

It was a strong win and while we showed flashes of the footy we need to play to continue to push the stronger teams, from the first bounce next week we need to deliver on that style of footy for four quarters. 
absolute best - you should be very proud of what you did to keep this a competitive and fun game to play.
